Dear Parents and Carers

As we near the end of term, I would like to take the opportunity to revisit the uniform expectations.

Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and helps allow students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for work.

It would be fair to say that, in the last two weeks, we have a number of interpretations of what is and is not acceptable uniform and we believe it is time to clarify our expectations for students and parents.

Please ensure your child comes to school in the required uniform, which includes:

- White or blue shirt/polo shirt
- Blue jumpers/sweatshirts
- Grey/black trousers or skirts
- Blue check dresses (optional for summer)

For footwear, black shoes suitable for school activities with flat heels are necessary for the safety and comfort of all students. Crocs and sliders are not permitted due to the health and safety risks they pose.

We also have specific kits for physical education, games, and swimming, including:

- Blue T-shirts and sports shorts
- Plimsolls or trainers
- Football boots (as needed)
- Swimming costumes and a towel
- Tracksuits for colder weather

School uniforms, including sweatshirts and polo shirts, are available for purchase directly through the school, with second-hand options offered to ensure affordability.

In cases where a student is unable to wear the full school uniform, we kindly ask you to ensure they still arrive in as much of the uniform as possible. For those without the proper attire, we will provide spare clean items for the day to ensure every student participates fully in school activities without inconvenience.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated in maintaining the standards of our school community. Thank you for your continued support and understanding.
